REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE - DUNREATH COTTAGES MANJIMUP (1822)

From the Dunreath Cottages Committee of Management advising that:-

"It has been brought to the attention of the Committee that finance is available through Homeswest for the erection of Aged Persons homes on locally owned land. These to be handed over at no cost to the organisation concerned for maintenance and management. Dunreath presently has a waiting list of 9 persons and is most anxious to acquire more units to fill the need.

As Dunreath land is vested in the Shire, the Committee respectfully requests that Council forward a submission to Homeswest on their behalf to obtain a further six units. The Committee would welcome the opportunity to discuss the proposal personally with Homeswest if this would assist in the application."

RECOMMENDATION

That staff liaise with Homeswest and Dunreath Cottages Committee to facilitate the construction of 6 units at the Dunreath facility.

Further that until full details of the project are known Council makes no financial commitment to the project.

PARKING FOR DISABLED - BYLAWS (1815)

Three disabled parking bays have been installed in Manjimup in Giblett Street and one bay has been installed in Pemberton. New bays are also proposed adjacent to Coles and Woolworths Supermarkets. At present Council does not have Bylaws to enforce these bays. The Department of Local Government has formulated Uniform Bylaws to regulate by able bodied persons in parking bays set aside for use by disabled persons.

The offences and penalties under the Bylaws are:-

1. Parking or standing of vehicle not displaying an ACROD sticker in a parking bay set aside by use by the disabled - infringement notice penalty \$30.
2. Parking or standing of vehicle displaying an ACROD sticker in a disabled persons parking bay when the vehicle is not used by a disabled person - infringement notice penalty \$40.
3. A general penalty of \$80 for a breach of the Bylaws.

The Bylaws will apply to all land including private land within a parking region defined in Councils Parking Bylaws. Parking bays set aside for use by disabled persons must be approved by Council and comply with the signposting requirements of the Bylaws.

It should be noted that a disabled persons can be either the driver or a passenger of a vehicle displaying an ACROD sticker.

ACROD is a national organisation working on behalf of people with disabilities and organisations that serve them. One of its tasks is to approve of the issuing of parking stickers to those persons who meets its disability requirements.

**RECOMMENDATION**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Act 1960, the Council of the Shire of Manjimup hereby resolves to adopt the Uniform General (Parking for Disabled) Bylaws as published in the Government Gazette of the 5th February, 1988.

Further that Council advise disabled people through the local press of the operations of ACROD.
