

## THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

*Manjimup District Road Board.*

P.W. 2326/24.

*By-laws for the Management and Use of the Road Board Hall and other Buildings under the Control of the Board.*

1. Interpretation clause.—In the construction of these By-laws:—
  - (a) The word "Board" shall mean the Manjimup District Road Board;
  - (b) The word "Building" shall mean and include any hall, room, or corridor of any such hall under the control of the Board.
2. Applications for the hire of any building or furniture shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board not less than 24 hours before the time that such building or furniture is required, and shall state the purpose for which the building or furniture is required.
3. The name and place of abode of the actual responsible person or persons hiring any building or furniture shall be given in the application for the use of such building or furniture.
4. The rent of the building or furniture shall be paid with the application, and shall be as set out in the schedule hereunder.
5. The hours for which any building or furniture may be hired shall be:—
  - (a) Day: 9 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.
  - (b) Evening: 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight.
  - (c) Extension of time may be granted upon payment of prescribed fees.
6. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of the same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

8. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any building or furniture.

9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such building or furniture shall be granted.

10. The hirer of any building shall comply with the Health Act provisions, Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hirings and use of any buildings. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts above-mentioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of the engagement forbid and prevent the use of such building.

11. In the event of the use of any building being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such building as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

12. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, or perry shall be brought into or consumed in any building during the term of engagement, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

13. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any building during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said building, whether such persons have been admitted by the payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.

14. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise, will not be allowed to enter the building.

15. No person shall, in any part of the building, enter or be—

- (a) allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
- (b) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
- (c) use profane or improper language;
- (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage, shall be liable to pay the cost of such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-laws.

(e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage-ways of any building. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.

16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, nor anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of peace, shall be permitted in any building.

17. The hirer of any building shall be responsible for—

- (a) maintaining good order and enforcing these By-laws;
- (b) any damage done to the building, fittings, fixtures, furniture, or crockeryware, or other part of the property.

18. The Secretary of the Board or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the building, or any part thereof, at all times during term of engagement, and every facility shall be given them for enforcing these By-laws.

19. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect hereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

*Schedule of Charges for Hall and Supper Room.*

## Hall—

Night: 7 p.m. to 12 midnight, 25s.; after 12 midnight, 3s. per hour or part of an hour.

Travelling Entertainments—35s. from 7 to 12 o'clock.

Picture Shows—From Monday to Friday, 30s. per night. Saturdays, 50s. per night.

Sample Room—5s. per day; night, 1s. per hour (two lights only).

Day: 2s. per hour, with a minimum of 5s.  
Board Room—  
Night: 1s. per hour, with a minimum of 3s.  
Day: 2s. 6d. per half-day of four hours; 5s. per day.  
Political Meetings—5s. per day; 10s. per night.  
Local Societies—As per special arrangement with the  
Board, in writing.  
Supper Room—  
Night: 5s. from 7 o'clock to 12 midnight.  
Day: 1s. per hour.  
Crockery—2s. 6d. when used in Hall. 6d. per dozen  
when used outside of building. All breakages or  
losses to be paid for at cost price.
