8.1 Developing Age Friendly Community Access & Inclusion Plan

- \$170k upgrading of old slab footpaths to concrete may include kerbing and pram ramps.
- ML Developing concept design for "safe street" Moore Street to include disable bays next to Church and Kearnan (Moore Street).
- Footpath on church side poor as well as parish side.
- More inclusive design for Moore Street.
- Path on roadside to save trees. Slow points at Brockman.
- Path from Ipsen to Mount Streets.
- Parking may or may not be available. May be angle parking.
- ML to bring plans to Committee for comments.
- ML curvy road to incorporate the different parking aspects.

8.2 Cherry Glades

- Currently 2 demountable buildings on site.
- There are a further 4 buildings to be place on site.
- The housing is still for over 55's
