 About 600 people enjoyed Australia Day in the Manjimup Heritage Park as part of the Shire's official celebrations on Tuesday 26 January 2021.
 It is always an honour to participate in the presentation of certificates and awards to the citizen of the year nominees and winners, this year we had 26 individuals and 3 groups nominated across the four categories. My congratulations and thanks to all nominees for the tireless work you do for your communities. The deserving award recipients are pictured below.
 Looking ahead in 2021
 We continue to be COVID Safe and the Shire has a thorough COVID Business Continuity Plan ready to be implemented immediately if needed, the plan ensures the continuation of essential services should an outbreak occur

within the Shire. In the meantime we continue business as usual within the safety guidelines set by the State and Federal Governments.
 This year we will see the following major projects - Pemberton Colocation building construction, air conditioner upgrade at the AquaCentre, Pioneer Park Walpole toilet upgrade, a new toilet block near the Pemberton Mill Hall, preparation for the redevelopment of the Rea Park and Collier Street Reserve, pathways and furniture at Quinninup dam, and major bridge works on Mordalup Road. We are bringing free wi-fi to Pemberton, Northcliffe and Walpole CBD's upgrades to the Northcliffe basketball courts and a pathway to Clem Collins Stadium. There are many smaller projects on the go as well as the tremendous amount of work that goes into the normal operations of a local government. The operation of a local government is far from being 'rates, roads and rubbish' our functions are diverse and we deliver an enormous number of services. We aim to remain responsive to the changing

needs and expectations within our community, continuing to support and enhance the sustainability and diversity of our communities.
 Some of our services and functions include:
 Infrastructure - local roads, bridges, footpaths, parking facilities, drainage, waste collection.
 Recreation and cultural facilities - libraries, parks, sports facilities, recreation centres and civic buildings.
 Environmental and health - water and food inspection, noise and animal control, fire and emergency services.
 Community development - cultural diversity, youth, ageing population, community care, volunteering, community safety and economic development.
 Building - approvals, inspections, licensing, certification and enforcement.
 Statutory and strategic planning - development approval, land use, sustainable environment, and local area planning.
