About 150 people turned out in Northcliffe to join in the Shire's official Australia Day celebrations on Sunday 26 January 2020.

It was again an honour to present certificates and awards to the citizen of the year nominees, this year we had 18 individuals and six groups nominated across the four categories. My congratulations and thanks to all nominees for the tireless work you do for your communities. The deserving award recipients are pictured below.

Manjimup Heritage Park open day.

An enormous amount of work has been undertaken at the Manjimup Heritage Park over the past two years as part of the Manjimup Town Centre Revitalisation Project.

You are invited to join us on 22 February 2020 to celebrate not only the transformation of the park into a vibrant multipurpose attraction but also to celebrate our heritage as the park represents it.

The transformation of the Heritage Park has included:

- the refurbishment of the State Timber Museum;
- building and fitout of the PowerUp Electricity Museum, including the new PARK café and the relocation of the Visitor Centre;
- construction of car parking and accessible pathways throughout the park;
- creation of the rail relics display;
- refurbishments throughout the Historic Hamlet

including access ramps, new pathways the addition of a blacksmith workshop and agricultural display shed;

- construction of a Volunteer Hub;
- building of the Sandra Donovan Sound Shell;
- CCTV security cameras throughout the park; and
- extensive landscaping and interpretive signage.

The park is looking fantastic and is a wonderful place for events and gatherings with an abundance of information about our heritage. The PowerUp Electricity Museum which tells the story of the development of electricity in WA is definitely worth a visit.
