## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We are continuing to lobby the State Government for a fair outcome from the Native Forestry Transition Package.

Nominations for Citizen of the Year Awards are now open. In 2023 the Shire will hold the official Australia Day celebrations in Pemberton with the Citizen of the Year Awards to be presented as part of the ceremony.

Beyond 2023 Council have agreed to give consideration to the Shire of Manjimup:

- Hosting an annual and inclusive community event on a date to be determined and rotated between Manjimup, Pemberton, Northcliffe and Walpole;
- Continuing with Auspire Citizen of the Year Awards, with the awards presented on a date to be determined;
- Not presenting the Citizen of the Year Awards on 26 January;
- Continuing to make a contribution to local communities holding an Australia Day event on the 26 January; and
- Encouraging Councillors to attend local Australia events and activities.
