
Six works will be purchased for printing and exhibiting on fixed street banner frames in the main street of Manjimup.

All other artworks received will be displayed in an exhibition in 2023 at the Manjimup Art Gallery.



Noongar country encompasses the entire south-western portion of Western Australia. The boundaries of Noongar country begin at a point north of Jurien Bay, then stretch easterly to a point approximately north of Moora and then south-east to a point on the southern coast between Bremer Bay and Esperance.
