
Councillor Bavich Resigns



Manjimup Town Centre Revitalisation Wellness & Respite Community Centre

The Wellness and Respite Community Centre was officially opened by Mr Rick Wilson MP on Friday 18 May 2018.

The Community Home Care team are now located at the new building.

The new Centre will:

- ensure clients (particularly those with dementia) are in a safe, stimulating and supervised environment;
- incorporate the Shire of Manjimup Home Community Care office;
- provide a one-stop shop for clients for information about aged & disability support.

Services to be offered at the Centre will include: social and recreational facilities;

- respite and support for carers:
- support with exercise and nutrition;
- Stay on your Feet program;
- access to relevant knowledge and information.

The Centre will house:

- an information and assistance kiosk (shop front/reception);
- multipurpose conference/meeting/function space, with commercial kitchen for hire; office accommodation:
- respite care unit including an 8 bed respite wing and dementia support capacity.
