### Support for Sport and Rec Clubs

The Shire of Manjimup has been successful in obtaining funding from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries to support local sports and recreation clubs. The program is a joint partnership between the Shire of Manjimup and the Shire of Nannup with the aim of resourcing and supporting sport and recreation clubs to create stronger, healthier, happier and safer communities. The program will receive \$15,000 grant funding in 2018/19 and a further \$10,000 in 2019/20. The construction of the SWEE facility will be undertaken by Civilcon (WA) Pty Ltd, a south west builder, and is expected to be opened in December 2019

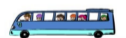

## Manjimup Town Centre Revitalisation

Northern Intersection (Perup & Graphite Roads) Request for tender seeking suitably qualified and experienced contractors for construction closed 19 October 2018, with report to Council 8 November. Works expected to be completed by May 2019.

### Brockman Street

The contract for the construction of the roof structure has been awarded to Karamfiles Builders.

Shire Officers are currently working with the contractor to finalise the construction details and program, taking into account planned community events and the Christmas period in order to minimise the disruption for shop owners and members of the public alike.

It is anticipated that works on installing the required footings will commence within the next month, although the majority of the works will be completed in early 2019.

Drainage works, which must be installed after installation of the required roof footings are likely to be undertaken within the first two months of 2019.

We are awaiting the outcome of a federal grant application made under the Federal Smart Cities Program. The funding has been sought to support the Shire's proposal to fit the Brockman Street roof with transparent solar panels as the roofing material, with the aim of powering the Shire Administration Building, Brockman Street and Manjin/Coronation Park.

The expected completion date for the project is May 2019.

### South West Energy Experience (SWEE)

Civilcon has been appointed the construction contract and commenced work on Monday 29 October 2018.

### Manjin Park

The basketball court is ready for use, some fencing will be installed in the coming weeks.

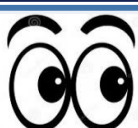
