



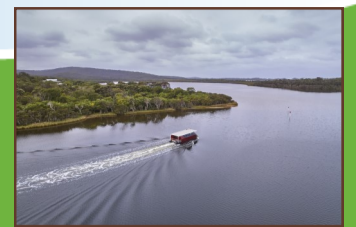

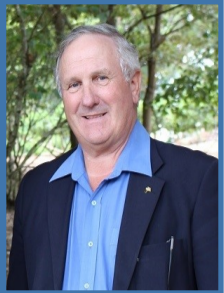

### A message from your Shire President Cr Paul Omodei

#### Easter/ANZAC

I trust you had a wonderful Easter break and hope that you managed to attend an ANZAC service near you to pay your respects to fallen soldiers who sacrificed so much for our way of life. Currently the Australian Roll of Honour lists 102,872 official deaths as a result of service with Australian units from 1860 to the present day. That is a very significant sacrifice that will be harder and harder to comprehend as the generations pass and the first hand stories of struggle and hardship from the World Wars are lost.

#### \$200,000 Grant

Shire Sustainability Officer Ann Bentley has been successful in obtaining \$200,000 in federal funding for biosecurity management of pests and weeds. The Shire was eligible for this funding as a drought affected (1-in-20 year rainfall deficiency) local council

where agriculture is a primary driver for the economy. The project will target vertebrate pests and invasive environmental weeds that are having a high impact on drought affected areas within the Shire.

#### 2019 Keep Australia Beautiful WA Tidy Towns Entry

The Shire, as a whole, is an entrant in the 2019 Keep Australia Beautiful WA Tidy Towns Sustainable Communities Awards Litter Prevention and Waste Management category, which recognises innovation and achievements in litter prevention, reducing and managing waste.

#### SWEE Name

A competition to name the new South West Energy experience museum in the Manjimup Heritage Park closed recently. Numerous entries were received and the judging panel decision will be presented to Council on 2 May 2019.

Please note that if there are confidential items to be discussed, members of the public may be asked to leave the room for a period of time.

### Annual Vergeside Hard Waste Collection

May 2019

The Shire of Manjimup is providing a hard waste collection in 2019. **This is a free service.**

- This service is only available to domestic properties which have an existing regular kerbside rubbish bin collection service.
- Hard waste is defined as furniture and other household goods.

**The service will collect:**

- old furniture
- mattresses
- televisions & stereos
- refrigerators or freezers **only with doors removed**
- air-conditioners
- other whitegoods
- carpet and lino
- general household hard waste

**The service will not collect:**

- general domestic waste (food scraps etc)
- gas cylinders and hazardous materials including asbestos and poisons
- green waste (lawn clippings or tree limbs)
- liquid waste (oils of any sort, paints, chemicals or poisons)
- building materials (cement, bricks and rubble, renovation discards, fluro light tubes)
- commercial crates (milk or bread), pallets, shopping trolleys etc
- vehicle tyres or batteries

**Hard waste collections start from:**

Manjimup, Jardee, Deanmill & Palgarup	from Monday 06/05/19
Northcliffe, Windy Harbour, Pemberton, Browns Road, Quininnup & Walpole	from Monday 13/05/19

- Please have your items out at least one week before the collection date in a place on your verge that will not be a danger or an inconvenience to others.
- Please do not put any items out after the Monday start date for collection in your town as it may not be collected and a litter infringement and fine may ensue.
- A maximum of 3 cubic metres (1m x 1m x 3m) may be collected per property. Properties with more than 3 cubic metres will have to make private arrangements to have their waste removed. Items longer than 2m will not be collected.

- All items collected from the verge will be sent either to landfill or to resource recovery.
- Each household's waste items must be placed only on their own section of verge; households shall not add their excess waste to another property's verge area.
- Every waste item remains the property of the household which placed it on the verge until the moment it is collected. If you would like to have a particular item from a verge then you should ask the property owner if you can take it. (Remember: Reuse is far better than sending an item to landfill!)

#### Trail Bike Hub

In 2017 the Shire of Manjimup undertook a feasibility study to develop and position Manjimup as a Trail Bike Hub. The study found that there is a significant market for trail bike trails and that Manjimup is well positioned to become a Hub for trail bike riding. In January 2019, the Manjimup Trail Bike Hub Inc. was established to support the Manjimup Trail Bike Hub to become the region's main destination for trail bike riding

Anybody interested in the project is encouraged to register their interest so that they can be kept up to date with the Hub's development and progress, particularly for when riders and businesses will be encouraged to get involved with the Hub themselves. #### Shire Activities

A primer seal has been placed on a small section of Springall Road, Manjimup.

Edge sealing has been completed on a section of Yanmah Road prior to a reseal by contractors.

The Wellness & Respite Community Centre has seen the completion of a new shed to protect the generator. This will serve as the power source in times of outages and provide coverage when respite clients are reliant on power for oxygen etc.

**Year One Super Readers' Program.**  
Thanks to the generous support of the Manjimup Lions Club, the Manjimup Library is piloting a new program aimed at developing stronger literacy skill in emergent readers. The Year One Super Readers' program will be open to all year one students attending primary school or being home-schooled in Manjimup.

#### Manjimup Town Centre Revitalisation

##### Graphite/Perup Roads realignment

Contractor TRACC Civil have completed the majority of the construction works, with sub-contractor Fulton Holton laying the final seal. Line marking and lighting is set to follow.

##### Brockman Street transformation

The framing for the first roof section is complete. Contractors under the direction of Water Corporation have relocated the water main. Once the final footings are poured and cured the framing for the second and third sections will be erected. The tender for supply of roofing panels has closed and a supplier is set to be confirmed at Council on 2 May 2019.

##### Manjimup Heritage Park

The State Timber Museum restoration project has been shortlisted in the WA Architecture Awards.

Rail and relics interpretation finalised, awaiting site clearance to install path network.

South West Energy Experience progressing well, internal services have commenced. Exhibition final reviews have occurred and graphics are being prepared. Procurement commenced for lighting and interactive displays.

Tobacco Kiln - mark out of new project to commence soon.

Agricultural Shed and Blacksmith Shop - procurement of exhibition has commenced and works will begin this month.
