The steel framing and part of the roof is on. Contractors are now working on the brickwork for the walls which will be completed in 2-3 weeks, internal services have commenced.

Final exhibition content reviews occurring this week and graphics and being prepared. Detailed landscape design complete.

Carbone are progressing well on the carparking, roundabout and drainage.

## **Graphite/Perup Roads realignment**

Contractor TRACC Civil are making good progress on the construction, the primer seal and kerbing is complete with traffic now using the new road layout.

## **Brockman Street transformation**

The framing for the first roof section is complete. The majority of the footings have been poured, we are waiting on Water Corporation for the relocation of a water main to continue, these works are scheduled for the weekend of 13 and 14 April 2019.
