Council Meeting

The next Ordinary Meeting of the Manjimup Shire Council will be held in the Council Chambers, Cnr Rose and Brockman Streets, Manjimup. The meeting commences at 5.30pm on Thursday, 17 January 2019. Copies of the agenda are available via the Shire website, at any library within the Shire of Manjimup or the Administration Office. Any person wishing to address or ask a question of the Council is welcome to do so at the start of the meeting. Please note that if there are confidential items to be discussed, members of the public may be asked to leave the room for a period of time.

Manjimup Town Centre Revitalisation What to expect this year.....

We are into the final year of the Town Centre Revitalisation Project. We have undergone some amazing transformations throughout the project and the benefits are definitely showing in tourism and economic growth for the region.

In 2019 we will see the completion of the realignment of Graphite and Perup Roads with South West Highway, the roof cover over Brockman Street and the completion of the South West Energy Experience Building.

So where are these project at?

South West Energy Experience

Expected completion in December 2019. Building

- Builder Civilcon commenced site works in October 2018.
- Working with the exhibition designer and café lessee to finalise fittings and fixtures.
- Electrical upgrade by Western Power is complete.

Exhibition Design

- Concept and materials schedule approved.
- Café lease appointed to Pianta Unit Trust. Working with cafe lessee regarding fitout. Landscaping
- Detailed landscape design contract awarded to Emerge Associates.

Graphite/Perup Roads realignment

Expected completion in May 2019.

TRACC Civil have been appointed for the construction and site works commenced in December 2018.

Brockman Street transformation

Karamfiles Builders have been appointed for the construction of the three section roof over Brockman Street from Giblett Street to Rose

Foundations are expected to commence in January, followed by the drainage in February and erection of the roof in March 2019.

The Town Centre Revitalisation Committee (consisting of Community and Shire representatives) and Council have approved the use of laser cut, back lit, aged steel for the uprights and red exposed aggregate concrete to identify pedestrian access ways, with darker areas for the alfresco sections.
