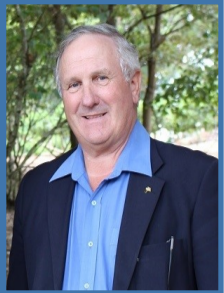

### Manjimup Town Centre Revitalisation

#### Graphite/Perup Roads realignment

Major construction works, lighting and line marking are now complete. Landscaping of the area will take place in the coming months.

#### Brockman Street transformation

The three sections of framing are now complete.

The roofing material has been ordered and we are currently requesting quotes for the installation.

We are finalising construction drawings for drainage, kerbing and road pavement.

### Manjimup Heritage Park

#### The South West Energy Experience Museum

- The museum will be called the Powerup Electricity Museum, the name was decided by a public competition and endorsed by Council on 2 May 2019.

- Construction is progressing well with the internal fit out commenced, graphics are being prepared and a consultant has been engaged for multi-media and interactive development.

- Two requests for tenders have been released for the landscaping works.

Mark out of a new project to construct a tobacco kiln will commence soon. Agricultural Shed and Blacksmith Shop - procurement of exhibition has commenced and works will begin this month.
