Approvals Required

The Shire is currently investigating a number of commercially run fitness classes being operated from buildings and/or locations that are not approved for this purpose, in some cases these operations are completely inappropriate due to a lack of formal parking and the activity not meeting the requirements of the Building Code of Australia. Prior to committing to a location or commencing operation, new businesses are strongly encouraged to liaise with the Shire's planning and building officers and obtain the required approvals.

An article reporting the gazettal of the local laws appeared in the Manjimup-Bridgetown Times on 12 June 2019 and was also published on the Shire website, facebook page and Antenno.

Shire President Paul Omodei stated "In accordance with part

5 of the new local laws, Council has the ability to apply time limits on CBD thoroughfares from 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 12:30pm on Saturday, except for public holidays. Council may impose any time limits which must be clearly signed. There has been no consideration of paid or metered parking".

Council first considered the introduction of timed parking at its meeting on 22 August 2019, with a particular focus on Brockman Street, which is being established as a food and beverage precinct with an extensive alfresco dining area.

Shire Officers will order the signs, erecting them shortly and commence implementation of an education campaign, working with residents and visitors alike until the general public is used to the changes.
