Brockman Street transformation

The civil works have been completed, with the red exposed aggregate footpath and contrasting applied to the alfresco and other non-footpath areas looking great, complemented by the new red asphalt road and parking areas.

Landscaping of the garden beds, including the mature trees is taking starting to look great.

Installation of the street furniture will be completed in coming weeks.

The installation of the central stainless steel gutter and downpipes for the roof has been completed.

Installation of the roofing material will commence shortly, completing the structure.
