

Shire Services - COVID-19

AquaCentre

The AquaCentre is open with full services and operating in line with COVID-19 WA roadmap phase 4 restrictions.

- Our new permanent opening hours are: Monday to Friday 6am to 7pm Saturday and Sunday 9am to 5pm Public holidays 10am to 5pm
- Fitness bookings are encouraged.
- You are able to use the fitness room unsupervised, please sanitise equipment after use.
- Crèche remains open, bookings are essential.
- You are expected to follow all social distancing rules.
- Sanitising stations will be available around the facility.

Manjimup Home & Community Care

- (MHCC) are continuing their services and support for seniors and vulnerable people in line with Government directives including shopping services and additional social support.
- The Wellness & Respite Community Centre is open for limited access with sanitising and infection control rules in place.
- Tai Chi has recommenced with a maximum of 10 people and appropriate social distancing applies.
- MHCC respite house is open for business.

For Public Comment Health Local Laws 2020

The Shire of Manjimup proposes to make a local law with regard to the public health of the district. Windy Harbour Campground

The Windy Harbour Campground is partially open with temporary restrictions to ensure compliance with social distancing, and hygiene.

- the camp kitchen will remain closed;
- each campsite catering for maximum of six persons;
- maximum of 50 campers who have access to the ablutions;
- fully self contained vehicles will be catered for;
- bookings through the caretaker essential- 9776 8019.

Waste Management

In order to continue provision of kerbside collection during the WA State Government's phase 4 easing of restrictions, residents are required to:

- ensure your bin lid is completely closed;
- put your bin out on the kerb the night before (early in the morning maybe too late);
- leave the bin at the kerb until it is emptied; and
- return your bin to a secure place when it has been emptied (this may take more than 24 hours).
