**Roll up for WA**

Commencing on Thursday 29 July 2021 the Western Australian Country Health Service is providing a one day per week COVID-19 vaccination clinic in the Manjimup Town Hall for people eligible to receive the Pfizer (Comirnaty) Vaccine.

The Shire of Manjimup has worked closely with the Western Australian Country Health Service to secure a State run public vaccination facility in the Lower South West Region that will take pressure off local private medical clinics and further limit the travel of local community members seeking to take up the offer to be vaccinated against COVID-19. As part of the arrangement the Shire is providing the Manjimup Town Hall at no cost as a large community venue for the vaccination program.

Mass vaccination against this infectious disease is critical, not only to protect individuals in our communities, but also to protect those who are either not yet eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccination or those that are unable to have a COVID-19 vaccination due to underlying health conditions.
