



Shire President's Message



Small Rise for Big Return

Council recently adopted the 2021/22 financial budget.

The budget encompasses a rate rise 3.41% and reflects a catch up of CPI based on the local government price index which is predicted to be 3.2% for 2021/22, and an attempt to put building blocks in place to recover from the zero percent rate rise due to COVID-19 last year.

It has been a difficult budget, in difficult circumstances, it includes a significant Shire wide road program in excess of \$7 million being a considerable investment in infrastructure across all towns. The budget is the instrument by which the Strategic Community Plan 2021-2031 and Council's Corporate Business Plan 2021-2025 are financed and put into action. The rate rise of 3.41 percent will go some way to return much needed funding for infrastructure

renewal works as well as providing the level of service indicated by ratepayers as indicated in the recent community survey.

Roll up for WA

The State run public vaccination facility in the Manjimup Town Hall has been well received by residents.

Elections

A Council election will be held on 16 October 2021. In the forthcoming election we require six councillors, each to complete a four year term;

Central Ward - 2, East Ward - 1, West Ward - 1, Coastal Ward - 1 and South Ward - 1.

If you have the time and a strong vision for

the best possible outcomes for the community you should consider nominating. The role of a Councillor is to: represent the interests of electors, ratepayers and residents of the district; provide leadership and guidance to the community; facilitate communication between the community and Council; participate in the local government's decision making processes at council meetings; and other functions given by the Act or other written law.

Local government candidates are required to complete an online induction. The induction takes about an hour and is very worthwhile, even if you are not running for Council, to gain an insight into the roles and responsibilities of councillors and the processes of local government.

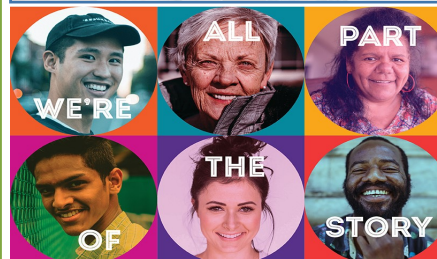
