PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Budget deliberations have been a major consideration of Council since March with Councillors and senior staff working together with the objective to find the best possible outcome for ratepayers whilst maintaining essential services and providing and improving infrastructure throughout the Shire. We are resigned to the fact that there will never be enough funds available to carry out everything desirable however we use all the guile, experience and judgement from years of local knowledge to arrive at what we consider to be a balanced approach to priorities set given available resources. The Shire, like everyone in the community are experiencing unprecedented cost escalations, all Shire services have been impacted by these increases. As always the budget has been produced with careful consideration of the Strategic Community Plan 2021-2031 and the Corporate Business Plan 2023-2027. Whilst the CPI for March 2022 to March 2023 is 5.8% for WA the 2023/24 budget proposes a rate rise of 6.9%, this has not been an easy decision as many in the community are experiencing financial stress. This budget continues to be focused on addressing maintenance of core infrastructure, but also carrying on work to the Shire's aging assets including recreation infrastructure. This year's total capital budget sits at \$18,743,407 including carry forwards, with \$6.3m on roads \$2.3m on land and buildings, \$8.2m on infrastructure and \$1.8 on plant and equipment.

Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2021

On the 1 July 2023 the new *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2021* came into effect. The new Act replaces the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972*.

What has not changed with the new Act is the need to seek approval for activities that may harm Aboriginal cultural heritage. The Department of Planning Lands and Heritage (DPLH) have developed guidelines to implement the Act which are designed to guide proponents in navigating the new framework.
