A QUICK GUIDE TO HEALTHWAY FUNDING



What does Healthway fund?

Healthway funds sport, arts, community activities, health promotion projects and research to inspire West Australians, especially young people, to live healthier lives. We work with organisations to create healthy activities and events and promote messages about good health throughout Western Australia.



How can my organisation partner with Healthway?

We offer three Health Project funding categories to support and advance health promotion projects and programs in WA.

- Under \$5,000 Health Project Grant
- Up to \$10,000 Aboriginal Health Project Grant
- Over \$5,000 Health Project Grant

We offer two categories of funding to support Arts, Community Events, Sport and Racing activities in WA.

- Under \$5,000 Partnership
- Over \$5,000 Partnership

Before Applying for Healthway funding it is strongly recommended that you read the funding guidelines and review application closing dates available on Healthway's website.



Is my organisation eligible?

You must be an incorporated organisation. This includes companies, not-for-profit organisations and statutory bodies. Funded organisations are required to meet minimum health policy requirements, available on the website.
