Healthway Healthy Sporting Club Program

The Healthway Healthy Sporting Club Program is now open for summer applications until 24 September. Clubs can apply for up to \$4,000 to purchase kitchen equipment, participate in Fuel to Go & Play online training and run educational workshops with the aim to increase healthy food and drink options within the club's canteen or kiosk.

To apply for this funding, clubs must be competing in a recognised summer sporting competition.

With the support of the Western Australian School Canteen Association, Healthway will help your sports club achieve the following:

- Increase healthy food and drink options at club-run canteens or kiosks.
- Reduce the promotion of unhealthy food and drink choices. This includes not prominently displaying sugary drinks for sale.
- Reduce the promotion of unhealthy messages or brands.
- Improve club members' knowledge of the importance of healthy eating.
- Educate canteen or kiosk managers, and/or staff (including volunteers) in offering healthy food and drinks in club-run facilities.

This season, clubs can also reward a healthy club coordinator with a \$400 voucher to coordinate the program. To apply or find out more about the program visit <u>www.healthway.wa.gov.au</u>.

State Government's Regional Economic Development Grants

Round 4 of the State Government's Regional Economic Development Grants is currently open and accepting applications. In the South West, up to \$150,000 per individual project is available.

Businesses must contribute a minimum 50% cash to the project. Not-for-profit or Aboriginal-owned entities may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Funding will be considered for individual projects that will increase or sustain jobs, expand or diversify industry, develop skills or capability, increase business productivity and attract new investment to the region.
