

Section AA': Allambie Park South with car park and picnic area (1: 250)

Opportunities/Design Features

- Use the wide canopy of high existing trees to provide shade to park/path users and infill bare areas with similar species to retain open parkland character
- · Create town 'entrance' for visitors entering from east and west by providing information, parking and facilities from where people can walk or cycle to town
- Provide bike hire with 24h access by using a computerised hire system and pick up/drop off points at key locations (e.g. tourist information, Timber & Heritage Park, Allambie Park)
- Use existing roundabout as display area for Manjimup's attractions
- Consult with neighbouring light industry landowners to improve integration of their properties into Linear Park

No consultation has occurred with Statutory Approval Authorities. This is planned to occur during the Detailed Design phase of the project. All concepts are subject to change depending on the requirements of these Statutory Authorities.
